TUBFRIM (TUBerculosis and FRIMerke)



The Tubfrim program has provided funds for years to aid disabled children in Norway. The program was established in 1928 in the Norwegian town of Nesbyen, originally raising money to aid the eradication of tuberculosis among children in Norway.

You need to trim stamps, leaving a quarter inch around the edges so as not to damage perforations. Then bring them to the Lodge for Evelyn Robison to send on to our District Coordinator, Jon Arild. One pound of trimmed stamps gives you one entry into the contest in which you can win ticket to Norway (up to \$1000 value).

Friday, January 13, 2017, was a lucky day for Vennskap Lodge #1-554 in Canby, Minnesota. Drawn from over 1000 other cards, the Lodge was the winner of the airline ticket to Norway, worth up to \$1,000.




The real reason the Irish celebrate St. Patrick's Day is because this is when St. Patrick drove the Norwegians out of Ireland! (use your Irish brogue)

Vikings of Lake "SMART GOALS" for 2017

- 1. Elect Nominating Committee of five members by August 2017.
- 2. Have a Prospective New Member Seminar in November 2017.

Fiskekaker (Norweigan Fish Cakes) Makes 6 cakes. Adapted from gooseberrymooseberry.com

Dry fillets with paper towels and cut into large pieces. Process fillet pieces in a food processor. Add egg white, corn starch, salt, pepper and nutmeg to processor and grind until blended. Set the processor to a low speed and slowly add milk through the chute until the mixture has a paste-like consistency, using as much milk as the mixture can absorb without becoming too watery to form the cakes. Add chives to mixture and process. Move mixture to a bowl. Heat oil in a large pan on medium heat. Divide mixture into 6 portions and form into cakes (roughly 2-3 inches wide). Fry cakes for four minutes each side or until golden brown. Serve and enjoy.

Ingredients: • 1 lb white fish fillets (such as cod or haddock) • ½ tsp salt • ¹/8 tsp pepper • ¹/8 tsp ground nutmeg • 1 egg white • 1½ tbsp corn starch • ½ to 1 cup ice-cold milk, more if needed • 1 tbsp finely chopped chives • 1-2 tbsp canola oil for frying

Remoulade Sauce Makes 1½ cups

1¼ cups mayonnaise • ¼ cup mustard • 1 tbsp sweet paprika • 1-2 tsp cajun or creole seasoning • 2 tsp prepared horseradish • 1 tsp pickle juice (can substitute lemon juice or vinegar) • 1 tsp hot sauce • 1 large minced and smashed garlic clove



"The Good News and...the Bad News!!!"

"Fueled by an atmospheric river that funneled a vast amount of moisture into Northern California, the severe winter storms that hit last month caused countywide damage. Perhaps the most prominent is the culvert failure and washout of Morton Road in Alta. The incident isolated 15 homes (and Camp Norge). An alternative access was established, however it traverses a steep, windy gravel road over private property." Placer County newspaper The picture to the left is where the road used to be and you can see

the depth of the washout. This was a major event!

The county expects to put out the bid, to build a permanent bridge over the washout, in mid-February and "hopes" to complete construction by the end of June 2017. They have \$3 million to complete the project. So----can we expect access to Camp Norge by the end of June? We don't really know and we won't know until the project is complete, to be completely honest and realistic.

As of now, we are cancelling all activities, including Camps Trollfjell/
Trollfjell Folkehøgskule, scheduled through the end of July. With this natural disaster occurring, there will be no revenue for Camp during these months. Therefore, our Caretaker has graciously agreed to resign from his position and leave the Camp. The Camp will remain closed to any visitors, whether Sons of Norway members or not, until this road repair is completed.

The Recreation Center Board of Directors has met over this issue and the Camps Trollfjell's Administrative Committee has had conversations. The Camp is financially prepared to be closed at this time. However, there are always ongoing expenses that must be met. Any Lodges or Sons of Norway members who wish to contribute to Camp Norge expenses are encouraged to do so. We will also be applying for a "Helping Hands to Members" Grant through the Sons of Norway Foundation to aid in this disaster.

Thank you all for your patience and understanding. We are looking forward to the opportunity to turn this "lemon into lemonade" and reopen later this year with great programs and activities, especially Hardanger Camp in August, Northern California Kretsstevne over Labor Day weekend and Rosemaling in October!! We'll keep you posted!
