#### **Judith Ingeborg Bergstrom**

Judith and her husband, Wayne, moved into the new home that they built, out on Watertrough Road near Indian Valley Reservoir almost exactly a year ago. They both are native-born Santa Rosans and came over to Lake County two years ago to build and start a quieter life.

Judith's Dad came to the US in 1927 and in 1936 went back to Norway where he married her Mom. Returning to the United States, they proceeded to have 8 children. Judith went back to

Norway with her Mom at about 4 1/2 years of age and lived there about 4 1/2 months and this is when she learned to speak Norwegian. After that her Grandmother would send her books so she would keep practicing reading it. Her Dad was from south of Ålesund and her Mom from Hønefoss. She was always told she was full-blooded Norwegian until she had her DNA tested and was disappointed to find out she is only 70% Norse (Northern European, Russian, etc. rounds it all out—oh, those Vikings)!

Judith spent her 50th birthday (December 30th) in Norway to experience being on her Father's Farm, where a cousin still lives, and to feel the winter there with its short dark days. Wayne's Great-Great-Grandmother came from Trondheim and he is doing research on Ancestry to learn more about that.

A special interest for Judith is Rosemaling so I mentioned the Rosemaling weekends at our Camp. She asked, "The one at Alta?". I told it was that same Camp...and she related that she had been kicked out of that Camp in 1967 while attending as a youth. As an older Camper, she was upset that, just because she already spoke Norwegian, they would use her doing that time to run the ringer washing machine and do up Campers' clothes/etc. She and another gal rebelled and that was that! It's quite the story! I suggested she give Camp another try, now that she's older and wiser, as we have other members who attend those Rosemaling weekends.

She would also like to teach the young children how to make cookies. She feels it is so important that we pass on the heritage that we know. Between her and Wayne, they have 7 children, so I think she's had some practice. So, please come on January 14th and welcome Judith and visit with her and Wayne. Their place in the country sounds lovely (maybe a lodge activity there sometime?).

# Norwegian Scientist Advances Study of Grid Cells in Human Brains

May-Britt Moser may not be a household name, however, she is a Noble Prize award winning scientist from Oslo, Norway, who holds a psychology degree and PhD in Neurophysiology from the University of Oslo.

In 2014 Moser, along with the Edvard I. Moser and John O'Keefe, were awarded the Nobel Prize for the discovery of human grid cells, a population of neurons that enables us to understand where we are in space. For example, the nerve cell in our brain called the hippocampus activates when we occupy a certain spot in a room. Then, other nerves activate when we move to another place in the room, forming a map of the environment in our brains.

With the identification of this grid, Moser and her scientific colleagues have set the bar for this field of study. Moser now continues to discover new information about human grid cells and hopes to ultimately map out how complex thoughts, such as memory, arise.

#### Sour Cream Porridge (Rømmegrøt) \*\*\*\*\*



- 1 2/3 cups 35% fat sour cream
- About 1 1/4 cups flour
- About 5 cups full fat milk
- 3/4 tsp salt

Sour cream porridge must be made from high fat (35%) natural sour cream with no stabilizers nor gelatin added. For the best results, use homemade sour cream. Heat 1 cup whipping cream to 95° F almost body temperature, then whisk in 2 tablespoons buttermilk.

Let stand at room temperature at least 8 hours, until thickened.

- +Simmer sour cream, covered, about 15 minutes.
- +Sift over 1/3 of the flour. Simmer until the butterfat begins to separate out. Skim off the fat.
- +Sift over the remaining flour and bring to a boil. Bring the milk to a boil and thin the porridge to desired consistency. Whisk until smooth. Simmer about 10 minutes, and season with salt. Serve with the skimmed butterfat, sugar and cinnamon.

\*\*\*\*\*This is the true Rømmegrøt. What we make at Camp and at the Lodge for Christmas is Fløtegrøt (made with sweet cream). Now you know why my Mom was confused in Norway!! It's the fault of the immigrants!
