

"The Harder They Fall" I'm pretty sure we all have grown up believing certain "proverbs" or sayings to be absolutely the Truth or at least words to believe in and/or live by. For example, (1) "You can't win the lottery if you don't buy a ticket" (2) Vote—or you can't complain about the outcome", (3) "What goes around comes around", and my favorite (4) "The Bigger they are, the Harder they Fall". The latter saying



comes from a 1956 Humphrey Bogart black and white boxing movie: "The Harder They Fall." Yesterday, Mary Beth and I awakened to witness a three-hour event: the toppling of a giant (90 ft tall) pine tree next door. What was most interesting was the first hour: a veteran (33 year) tree service "trimmer" using a simple chain saw in a crane-operated bucket trimming 40-50 feet of branches to 10 feet of the top. While taking multiple pictures and talking to the owner of the service, the operator toppled the top 10 feet before starting down the tree in four foot increments until he got down to a four foot stump. It took twice as long to clean up, chip and haul away the four foot logs as it did to topple the tree. **Gone** was the 30 year old, 90 foot tree that was our "neighbor" for the past 18 plus years of our life here in Hidden Valley Lake! A requested recipe from the October Potluck luncheon—umm-umm good!

Red Cabbage

2 tbsp butter

1 red cabbage, about 2.5 lbs

2 cooking apples

6 tsps. Cider vinegar

3/4 c. water

4 tbsp red currant jelly

2-3 tbsp sugar

salt ground pepper

ground pepper



Core and slice the red cabbage——Peel, core and dice the apples

Melt butter in a large flameproof casserole or pan and add the shredded cabbage and apples

Season with salt/pepper and fry gently, tossing the ingredients together until well mixed and coated with butter. Take care not to allow the cabbage to catch on the bottom of the pan.

Add the vinegar and water to pan, cover and cook gently for 2 hours until the cabbage is tender. Add the sugar and jelly to taste.

Farsdag, or Father's Day, in Norway!



November 11, 2018

Originating in the U.S., it caught on in Nordic countries after World War II. In Norway, Father's Day was first celebrated informally in 1930, following the American tradition of

June observance. The 1949 decision to make Farsdag official and move the holiday to November was commerce-related. Business owners reasoned that having it in November would boost sales during the lull before the Christmas shopping season. This practice took hold in Sweden and Norway but Denmark decided to continue celebrating in June, along with the Americans. Norwegian tradition is to celebrate fathers with good food, a fun activity, relaxation, family time, cards, gifts or flowers. Honoring Dad doesn't necessarily mean it has to be an expensive gifts; homemade items are just as koselig (nice/cozy) as store-bought and spending quality time together is a common way to observe the day without going overboard. District Updates—Kretsstevner 2018

This fall we had three very successful District Kretsstevner. What happens at a Kretsstevne? Members of District Six, Sons of Norway, get together to celebrate our heritage, eat, drink, sing, dance, play horseshoes, Viking games, taste wine, food demonstrations and enjoy time with all our fraternal sisters and brothers.



In addition, our Kretsstevner also raise money for Camp Norge. Three Kretsstevner

were held this year; the Northern was held at Camp Norge over Labor Day weekend, the Central held in Buellton, CA the first weekend in October and the Southern in Banning, CA over the third weekend in October. Approximately 20 different lodges participated in the three events. I was fortunate to attend all three. This year the three Kretsstevner raised over \$4000 for Camp Norge. Thank you to all the volunteers and members who donate their time, food, items for auctions and drawings. Your efforts are appreciated by the members of District Six.

To District 6 Lodges:

Thank-you for saving stamped envelopes and/or stamps. This assists us with our endeavor to help children through a Norwegian organization called Tubfrim. The mission is to collect and sell used stamps to stamp dealers and collectors and use the proceeds to aid Norwegian children. Sons of Norway members are the largest contributor outside of Norway to Tubfrim's efforts, sending nearly 30% of all stamps collected. Tubfrim is celebrating its 90th year of doing wonderful things for the children of Norway. It started in 1928 when the Postmaster thought that there has to be some use for all these old stamps. He started collecting stamps and started Tubfrim, which is short for Tuberculosis and frimerker (Norwegian for stamps). Over the years, Tubfrim has distributed over 23 million kroner to Tuberculosis research (initially) and then to handicapped children.

However, now due to the immigration and refugee problem, tuberculosis has been brought back to Norway. This year Tubfrim has donated approximately \$100,000. They had applications from 237 organizations for funds, and they only distributed to 20 recipients. 50% of their funds are given for Tuberculosis once again, and the other 50% are given to organizations or individuals that have physical or maybe even mental handicaps. So the money really does good - stamps for a good cause.

The Norwegian Seamen's Church in San Francisco just (9/27) delivered 16 boxes of stamps (272 lbs.) to the freight forwarder in South San Francisco, They, in turn, will secure the boxes on a pallet which will be put on a ship to Los Angeles with estimated arrival in Oslo on November 10, 2018. With any luck, the lodges that contributed to this shipment will get a thank-you note from Tubfrim sometime in December.


