"IN FOCUS WITH 20-20 VISION"

The last year has been extremely busy for the District Six Board. They have been working on many projects. Here are some updates and upcoming events.

Camp Oldfjell was held September 2019, with great success. I was able to attend and participate in a tablet weaving class. I finished my project and have completed my level one in the Sons of Norway Cultural Skills Program for weaving. I also had the opportunity to teach a Viking Wire weaving class. Already, planning for 2020 is in progress.

The second week in November, I was in Minneapolis to participate in the District Presidents meeting and network with the International Board. We had an opportunity to do some brain storming with the International Board and a facilitator. We looked at what issues may be holding back Sons of Norway's progress and success. A number of changes in structure at Headquarters have been implemented as well as new staff hired to address customer service in both the insurance sales and fraternal side. In addition, more insurance professionals have been hired and new financial products have been released.

Guides for Leadership have been updated by the District Presidents and should be available for use by lodges, soon. The new guides are more streamlined and address the job responsibilities of each position. The revised guides should be available for incoming officers.

District membership. Thank you for your efforts in recruiting new members. Our District has stayed in the positive column (meaning no overall loss in member totals) in respect to membership. A number of our lodges will receive Founders Awards for member recruitment.

You will be receiving more information about the District Six Lodge Meeting and Convention in Mesa AZ. I hope you have submitted your name as a candidate to represent your lodge as a delegate, or are planning to attend on your own, as a guest. Prior to the convention, there will be an educational session, which will include both genealogy and music Cultural Skills programs. On Friday morning, there will be interesting leadership sessions for all attendees. Remember, the members of the District Six Board of Directors are your hosts. This is the second convention that the Board has taken on the responsibility of organizing the Convention as well as the District Lodge Meeting.

The District Six Recreation Center Board is also busy with many projects including replacing the outside deck of the social hall and the flooring inside the social hall. It is a lot of work to maintain our camp buildings and property. The Recreation Center Board is very involved in the day-to-day operations of the camp. In an effort to be more responsive, in a timely manner, the board is experimenting with online distance meetings.

The District Six Board continues to work on behalf our lodges with "20-20 VISION" to keep the future of Sons of Norway "in focus."

So, you want to be a delegate to the International Convention (Lodge Meeting) in Norway in 2020. Yes, you want to ring in the New Year with your sights on Ringsaker (pronounced Ringsocker), Norway, the site of the big event in August! It is certain to be a special time to celebrate the 125th Anniversary of Sons of Norway!

Some folks are **automatic delegates** to this biennial event, and for District Six they are:

1) the current District President, Luella Grangaard, as the first District Delegate, and 2) a second District Delegate is elected from the District Board per our Bylaws. That's it? Uff da, yah, that's it! Also, our District International Director, Mary Beth Ingvoldstad, attends as an International Board Member. Now...how can you go if you are not Luella or Mary Beth or an Executive Officer of District Six? You can simply go as a "Guest", or you can throw your hat in the ring and run for a delegate position at the District Six Lodge Meeting and Convention, in Mesa, AZ this June!!

First, you must **attend the District Six Convention** (Lodge Meeting) in Mesa, Arizona in June 2020 as a delegate from your local lodge, or be a District Six Board Member. The delegates (from each lodge) must be elected by their lodge members <u>before</u> March 2020. If elected, your lodge may be able to provide you some monetary assistance or not. You may be able to assist in a fund-raising activity to support delegates from your lodge.

Second, at that District Convention you can **run for the position of International Delegate** in your Zone Caucus (which meets during the session to elect the Zone Director and one Delegate/one alternate per every 300 members in that Zone to the International Convention) or an at-large Delegate during the general session. At that time, the entire body votes on the final designated number of delegates, and alternates, that District Six is allowed. The Convention Body votes on the per diem and travel allowance in concurrence with recommendations from the District Treasurer and the Finance Committee...

Third, you must own a financial product through Sons of Norway to attend the International Lodge Meeting as this is the governing body for our organization which is a multi-million-dollar insurance company. If you do not already own a financial product, there are many available, in many price ranges and areas of personal need, for you to purchase through a Sons of Norway Financial Benefits Counselor or Sons of Norway Insurance Agent.

It' time to start planning for all the big events in Sons of Norway in 2020!

Greetings to all District Six members,

November 20, 2019

This is a reminder of the process for the election of delegates and alternates to the 2020 District Six Lodge Meeting and Convention. The notification of the number of delegates allowed for each lodge will be available in January 2020, after the year end membership reports are available. From the Charter and Constitutions – Election of Delegates must take place prior to the month of March before a District Lodge Meeting. At the same time, an equal or greater number of Alternates shall be elected to fill the places of duly elected Delegates prevented from attending the meeting, the first duly elected alternate filling the first vacancy, the second the next vacancy, etc.

Come early for the educational and fun Sessions on Thursday and Friday. Plan your days of participation accordingly. Remember, any lodge member may attend as a guest.

Costs are a key concern for delegates and lodges. Now might be the time to start a discussion about special fundraising to assist in sending delegates to the Convention. The delegate package is \$325; guest package is \$285. Room costs at the Sheraton Mesa Hotel are \$105/night plus 14.02 % tax, roughly \$120 per night total (plus \$10.00 per night for each guest over double occupancy). Assistance with finding a roommate will be available – note such request on your registration form.

Attending a District Convention is fun and educational: you learn more about Sons of Norway; you are updated and informed about the state of District Six; you meet folks from other lodges; you gain insight from cultural sessions and a leadership session; you help chart the course of our organization; and of course, you enjoy seeing wonderful entries in the Folk Art Exhibition and Competition. Delegates come back enthused with new ideas to help lodges grow and thrive. Conventions are including more heritage and culture, but be assured, there's business to attend to as well. Next year's Convention will be full of fun, heritage, and culture as well as the business of our future. We hope to see you there.

Writing a Resolution for the District Six Biennial Lodge Meeting & Convention

We want improvements to our organization, but often we are stymied as to how to affect changes. Contrary to the cliché that Sons of Norway is resistant to change - you know, 'that's the way we've always done it' - we are changing, and often for the better. Change is sometimes mandated by our changing regulatory environment, and we have to make changes just to keep up-to-date and in compliance.

The District Six Biennial Lodge Meeting & Convention in June, 2020 is a venue to affect grass-root positive change in our organization. Writing a resolution for change, however, can be a daunting task in itself. Searching online for how to write a resolution, you'll find numerous examples and opinions: capitalize the word whereas; don't capitalize whereas; use a semicolon here, put the word 'and' there. Uff-da. But now, there's a resolution template on the Sons of Norway website to help you through the process of writing a resolution.

Log in. Click MEMBER RESOURCES. Click 'read more' under Lodge Leadership Resources. Click 'learn more' under Administrative Resources. Scroll down to click on Governance. See the Procedure for Writing a Resolution, on the right. Download the worksheet to see the template, general considerations, and a fun example. https://www.sofn.com/member_resources/lodge_leadership_resources/governance/

Using this template should create consistency between lodge, district, and international resolutions. If your lodge is considering submitting a resolution, please review the resolution template first page for other instructions and considerations.

Often, change happens first, then we have to update or revise our bylaws, policies, and procedures. Funny how that happens. The District Board of Directors tries to keep us updated with such resolutions, and it seems like a never ending task. If your lodge sees an opportunity for submitting a resolution, you may check with District Secretary, Nancy Madson, to see if the District Board is submitting a resolution of the same nature.

Deadline to submit a resolution to the District Secretary – March 15, 2020, prior to the District Board's spring meeting.



IT IS TIME TO SIGN-UP FOR 2020 CAMP!

???WHY the COST

for a Convention Delegate package???

Setting a price for the delegate package at convention is difficult. Sometimes people think it is the cost of food. Well, that is a big component of the cost. When food is purchased through banquet services there is a base cost for the food, plus tax and service fee. So a food item that initially costs \$40 with all the additional charges quickly becomes \$53.00. Coffee costs at hotels runs around \$48 to \$60 per gallon. Usually 6 gallons are served at a coffee break. Then add the tax and the service charge, this becomes a major expense. I don't drink coffee but at every event I go to I am paying for coffee as part of my registration fee. For me it is just part of the deal.

The next big expense is audio visual. At the 2018 convention, the district's cost for AV was over \$12,000. The meeting hosts are always looking for ways to reduce this cost, but also meet our needs. We need to have microphones, projection and recording. Much of this has become very complicated, and therefore we need an AV person there to deal with issues. So we need to pay an hourly rate for a staff person. Some people ask, well, I have a projector and a microphone from my lodge. When hosting an event in a hotel you must pay a fee to bring in your own equipment. This also then requires staff or volunteers to operate the equipment.

Entertainment costs vary and are controllable. However, things like dance floors cost, and pianos cost. Special speakers may have a cost.

Set up. Usually tables and linens are provided as well as water stations. Also, there is a cost to provide and set-up the risers at the front of the meeting room. This is provided by the AV provider at the Mesa Sheraton.

Delegate materials. The delegate book which is created, printed and assembled by the district Secretary is a cost. The Convention ad book is used as a fund raiser. However, it is usually budgeted to break even. The delegate bag and inserts from Sons of Norway are all free, which this year will include the large Charter and Constitution.

All the other stuff. The gifts often have a cost. Ribbons and awards have costs.

So with all that being said, the cost for the 2020 District Six Convention and lodge meeting is \$325 for a delegate and \$285 for a guest. However, there will be individual tickets available for guests for the two evening meals.

The District Board hopes you see that the value of attending the Convention is more than the cost of the packet. It is about representing our lodge and being part of the process to assure the future of Sons of Norway. And sharing time with our fraternal family and 'Celebrating Our Roots'.

We hope to see YOU there!

Our distribution list contains over 2600 District Six members, but only about 20% of these actually follow the link to the newsletter. We suspect that some of the 80% may not have gotten the email notice due to spam filters. There are a few things that you can do to find our email announcements:

Check your spam folder, it may be there
If you are using Gmail, and have the default Social folder, check there.

All these announcements have a Form email address of webmaster@sofn6.org. By putting this in your email address book, it will help your system know that you want email from this sender.

Of course, the people who need this information the most, will not get it. If you successfully got the notice for this newsletter, please print a few copies and take them to your next lodge meeting. Ask if others also received our notice. Anyone who has not, please give them a copy of this Tech Tip.
